North Antrim U14 Hurling Feile

St Brendans 6:09 Loughguile 0:00

St Brendans got off to the perfect start in the North Antrim Under 14 Feile on Saturday past when they overcame Loughguile at Fr Maginn Park, all their scores coming from play. Wind assisted in the first half and on a heavy pitch it took St Brendans four minutes to breakdown a resilient and determined Loughguile defence. St Brendans first score coming after a long clearance from half back Donal O'Hara found Declan Trainer, thirty yards out and in space without hesitation he put the sliothar between the uprights. Three minutes later the white flag was raised again, Connor McNeill this time taking advantage of some quick stick work from Conleth McNeill and off loading the sliothar, Connor steadied himself to fire over from an acute angle. A minute later Connor McNeill was on the scoreboard again this time Aidan Corbett the centre half back the provider. A blistering period between the tenth and fifteenth minutes saw St Brendans pull away from Loughguile. Three decisive scores firstly Phelim Duffin netted from close in after a hopeful ball was sent in by Mathew McCartan. This was followed one minute later when Declan Trainer stepped inside his marker and riffled the ball from twenty yards out past the gallant Connor Christie (Loughguile goalkeeper), Declan Trainer turned provider for the third goal feeding the sliothar in for Conleth McNeill to pull sweetly to the net. This finished the game as a contest, however Loughguile never gave up with Conair Blair and Aron Carey covering ever blade of grass and Connor Christie pulling off some unbelievable saves. St Brendans added a fourth point in the final minute of the half when the sliothar was tapped out to Connor McNeill and finding himself on the twenty-one with only the goalkeeper to beat, he elected to driving the sliothar inches over the bar.

The second half started much the same way as the first half finished with Connor Christie being called upon in the first minute to pull off two magnificent saves firstly from Andrew McLarnon and then Eoin Magee's close range strike before Conleth McNeill fired home from fifteen yards out. Eoin Donnelly one of five substitutes introduced at half time duly got his name on the scoreboard in the second minute with a well taken point from forty yards out after a ground pass from Gareth McKeown left him with lots of space and time. The best score of the day came from the Caman of Eoin Magee, picking up the sliothar right out on the sideline about twenty five yards from the end line and the strong wind into his face, he drove the sliothar over the black marking. Two points followed from Declan Trainer and one from Connor McNeill between the ninth and fourteenth minute of the second half. Conleth McNeill finished the game off with a brace of goals firstly pulling in the air on an Eoin Donnelly pass and the second a short pass inside from Declan Trainer, Conleth grabbed the sliothar, swivelled and struck the ball past the netkeeper. Although St Brendans forwards rightly deserve the plaudits, the backs and midfield were strong, they provided the springboard for the forwards, clearing every ball that crossed the halfway line, with Donal O'Hara, Peter Mullholland, Colm Nesson and Ruairi Laverty playing some great hurling.
